Competitors will book in and choose their running order for each class on the day of the show.

QUALIFYING CARDS FOR ALL ACHIEVING A SCORE OF 170 OR MORE

These Rules and Regulations are to be read in conjunction with The Kennel Club Rally Competition Regulations S under which this competition is licensed. It is the responsibility of everyone entering this competition to make themselves familiar with the Kennel Club S Regulations, available from The Kennel Club

- Judges and reserve judges are as listed above.
- There are no sponsors for this event.
- Entry fees are £6 per class. Entries may be made on line via 'With Your Dog'.
- Awards are as detailed above
- the Competition opens at 8.30, , first judging 10.00
- First walk through 9.30
- No bitch in season id allowed to compete.
- The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden
- The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their full details recorded on the entry form.
- In the event that the competition is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the competition processor has the facilities to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show, but in any event the club will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
- Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
- It is the competitors responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
- Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the judges, may alter

arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.

- Only dogs of six calendar months of age and over on the first day of the competition are eligible to take part in Level 1 and 2 classes. Only dogs of 12 calendar months of age and over on the first day of the competition are eligible to take part in Level 3 or higher or special classes which incorporate jumps or similar exercises.
- In classes without a full running order, dogs will be received until one hour after the commencement of judging of their class after which no dogs may be received except under unforeseen and exceptional circumstances and by special permission of the Show Management.
- No entry passes will be issued.
- No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
- No competitor shall impugn the decision of the Judge or Judges.
- After a dog has commenced competing in a class no substitution of handler is permitted in that class.
- For the duration of the show all dogs, including those in the exercise area must be on a lead except when competing or practicing prior to competition.
- Food and/or toys shall not be carried or given to a dog under test.
- The attention of competitors is drawn specifically to Kennel Club Rally Competition Regulations 9, 17 and 19.
- A dog cannot be entered in the same class more than once.
- Once a dog has entered the ring to compete no further practice may be carried out.
- A dog must, at the time of entry for the competition, be registered as required by Kennel Club Rules and Regulations in the owners name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of joint registered owners the full name of every registered owner must be given. Where an owner makes an entry on behalf of another joint registered owner(s) or where an agent enters on behalf of a single owner or joint registered owner(s) such person must have the authority and consent from the single or joint registered owner(s) to sign the entry form on their behalf thereby binding them all to Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. In the event of any dispute, evidence of such authority and consent will be required. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a competition may compete as the owners new property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form (and in accordance with the conditions set out above).
- Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge
- Following discussion between the Chief Steward and show management and/or veterinary surgeon a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the Show if it is:- a) a bitch which is in season, b) suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, c) interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent, d) of such temperament or so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal, e) likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing. The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the show incident book and submitted to the Kennel Club
- Judges discretion prevails and judges decisions are final.
- Welfare of dogs.** An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
- No modifications may be made to the schedule once published except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club which must be followed by advertisement in the Canine

Press if possible.

32. Animals allowed in Event. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of a dog show during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
33. **DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk if left in a vehicle in hot weather. Please take care of your dog. If your dog found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

ELIGIBILITY AND SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

Classes at Rally Competitions. A competition host may stage one or more special classes not conforming to the standard class tests set out in Annex C of the Regulations. Such classes must contain the word 'Special' in the title of the class, and shall not count towards progression, titles or awards in standard competition classes.

Levels. Rally handler/dog teams compete at one of six levels, from Level 1 to Level 6. Progression to the next level does not require wins or places. Qualification is by achieving a score of at least 170 out of 200 on three occasions under three different judges.

Eligibility. When entered for a competition, a dog must be entered in a standard class at the level for which it is eligible as defines below. The dog may also, if desired, be entered in one further standard class at the next level up, if scheduled, plus on additional special class, if scheduled. In the following definitions, 'achieved Level 1 Title', 'achieved Level 2 Title' and so on means that the dog meets the requirements of having gained three qualifying scores of 170 or better, earned under three different judges, at the relevant level.

Level 1 – Open to dogs which have not achieved Level 1 Title

Level 2 – Open to all dogs which have achieved a Level 1 Title, except those that have achieved a Level 2 Title. Dogs eligible for and entered at Level 1 may also enter at this Level.

Level 3 – Open to all dogs that have achieved a Level 2 Title, except those that have achieved a Level 3 Title. Dogs eligible for and entered at Level 2 may also enter at this Level.

Level 4 - Open to all dogs that have achieved a Level 3 Title, except those that have achieved a Level 4 Title. Dogs eligible for and entered at Level 3 may also enter at this Level.

Level 5 - Open to all dogs that have achieved a Level 4 Title, except those that have achieved a Level 5 Title. Dogs eligible for and entered at Level 4 may also enter at this Level.

Level 6 - Open to all dogs that have achieved a Level 5 Title. Dogs eligible for and entered at Level 5 may also enter at this Level.

Directions to the venue

The venue is situated on the A334 between Botley and Wickham and can be accessed from the M27 junction 7 if travelling from the North or West and junction 10 (& A32) if travelling from the South and East.
